

# NOTICE TO PRINCIPAL EXPLANATION

The intention and purpose of the letter for parents and children is to point out clearly to the school, yours and your child's basic human rights are being impinged upon by the school insisting your child be taught radical gender theory and inappropriate sexual content.

You have International binding agreements which have been also scheduled into Australian Federal legislation, that you are informing the school of.

Many principals and teaching staff may be blissfully ignorant that they are in breach of such legislation and you are respectfully drawing their attention to these facts.

There are 2 versions of the letter:

## Option 1:

A letter for your child to sign as well as yourself, that your child can take to school and present to the front office staff to be handed to the Principal. This would be for children 12 years and older.

## Option 2:

A letter for you to sign that your child also signs ( if they are comfortable ), to be delivered to the school.

Acknowledgment that your child may not be comfortable signing as they may have the assumption they will be bullied by the teacher or school. One suggestion may be to gently explain to your child that they are signing to verify they want their basic human rights upheld and the letter is for this purpose.

We reiterate the last thing we want is for your child to feel pressured, just a reminder they are being pressured by the school to participate in such teachings of gender theory and inappropriate content.

This is not a letter we lightly suggest and the idea for such letter has been born out of schools lack of transparency and dismissive attitudes regarding parent requests, for this content not to be taught.

Even if you consider that you have a good relationship with the school, our suggestion is it would be a good idea to get on the front foot as a respectful reminder to the school. As this agenda will only increase and even the schools who claim they don't teach

gender theory and inappropriate sexual content will soon be forced to do so by the Education Department relative to each state.

**PLEASE DO NOT :**

- Do not share the No Consent letter on social media.
- Do not print the No Consent letter out and deliver to letterboxes, or bulk print out and hand to other parents at school drop offs and pick ups.

**WHAT YOU CAN DO :**

- Download the applicable No Consent letter for personal use.
- Direct others to the site to download themselves.
- Privately email the No Consent letter to other parents.

We trust this provides you with the clarity and explanation so you have the confidence to use the letter of No Consent. Please be reminded this is not an aggressive act to send such letter more of a respectful reminder to schools in an assertive way to send a message yours and your child's rights are paramount and have greater standing lawfully than the wishes of the school when it comes to the Education of your child.
